When you are near any electrical equipment, be careful. Electricity is a very safe form of energy. If you don't tamper with it. The easiest way to ensure that you are safe is to follow instruction carefully.

Electrical wire should be treated with respect whether that wire is large or small. Insulating material sometimes do not give complete protection because weather or age could have destroyed it. So the best precaution is to stay clear of them.

You can also be injured without even touching the wire. This is because if you get very close to high voltage cables, the electricity can jump at you through the air and give you a shock that can be fatal.

All electrical towers have insulators. this insulation protects the electric current from finding a path through the pole to the ground. Sometimes the insulator can get damage and cause the pole to get electric current. If you touch such a pole you'll get a shock. The safest way is do not have a habit of touching electric pole. And as a sign of warning there is always a sign written "dnager" and human skull beside it. Even though a person may not be able to learn he / she will be

able to interprite the diagram.

Don,t clib a tree that is growing under or near electric wires. Your weight can bed the branch and touch the wire.
