1. Identify five literary forms used in writing the Bible. (5mks)

- poetic

2. Describe the first account of creation (5mks)

- Day 1 - light and darkness
- Day 2 - sky
- Day 3 - land, sea, vegetation
- Day 4 - sun, moon, stars
- Day 5 - birds and sea creatures
- Day 6 - animals and human beings
- Day 7 - God rested $5 \times 1 = 5 \text{ marks}$

3. Mention five causes of evil in Traditional African Society. (5mks)

- Caused by evil spirits/bad spirits.
 - Disobeying elders/parents/relatives leading to curses.
 - Breaking of oath/will.
 - Failure to honour rituals/taboo/customs, norms and ancestors.
 - Murder/incest, rape/killing sacred animals.
 - Magic/sorcery/witchcraft.
 - Acquired from parents/inheritance.

4. Give five reasons why Abraham is referred as the father of faith. (5mks)

- Agreed to leave his homeland to go to foreign land.
 - Accepted to sacrifice his only son to God.
 - Believed in God's promises of a son despite the old age of his wife.
 - Entered a covenant with God.
 - Accepted circumcision together with his descendants.
 - Worshipped and sacrificed to God.

5. Give importance of circumcision to Abraham and his descendants. (5mks)

- Sign of Abrahams obedience and faithfulness to God.
 - Sign of bond between God, Abraham and his descendants.
 - Sign of covenant between God, Abraham and descendants.
 - Sign of belonging to the Jewish community/identity.
 - Sign that Abraham and his descendants were Gods people.
 - Sign of fulfilment of God's promises to Abraham and his descendants.

- Obedience to God is important.

- Established good international relations with neighbouring nations.
- Improved economic status of Israel by encouraging trade with other nations.
- He had outstanding leadership qualities.
- Defeated philistines, the most feared in the region.
- United the nation of Israel.
- Composed psalms that were used to worshipping God.
- Organised the administrative systems of Israel. $5 \times 1 = 5 \text{ marks}$

9. State five failures of king Ahab. (5mks)

- Allowed idol worship in Israel.
- Allowed his wife Jezebel to bear false witness against Naboth.
- Coveted Naboth's vineyard.
- Killed Naboth.
- Took Naboth's vineyard unlawfully.
- Worshipped idols.
- Used the name of God in vain when he said that Naboth had blasphemed God.

- Born of virgin as prophesied in Isaiah 7:14.
- Joseph the father of Jesus was a descendant of David.
- The same titles which were given by prophet Isaiah to the messiah are repeated by angel Gabriel as he announces the birth of Jesus to Mary.
- At birth his parents moved to Bethlehem the city of David and this fulfilled what prophet Micah prophesied.
- Jesus referred to the old testament when he first entered the synagogue on the Sabbath day.
- The life death and resurrection of Jesus are a clear fulfilment of what the old testament prophets prophesied.
- His cheerful death on the cross is a fulfilment of Isaiah
- The resurrection of Jesus fulfilled old testament prophecy that at the end of the suffering he would be restored at Gods side.

- One debtor owed his master 100 barrels of oil, he asked the debtor to change this to 50 barrels. The second servant owed 100 measures of wheat, he told him to bring 50.
- The master praised the manager for doing such a shrewd thing.
